

INDIRECT COST POLICY

The Montana Institute (TMI) works with community organizations, non-profits, universities, and local, state, federal and tribal agencies to increase health and safety across a wide variety of issues. In the course of this work, TMI often contracts with individual contractors, private organizations, researchers, non-profits, and universities to carry out health and safety interventions.

It is the policy of TMI to provide an indirect cost recovery of 10 percent of project costs.

This is the maximum rate allowed. A contractor with an actual indirect cost rate lower than the maximum rate provided above should not increase the funding request to the maximum allowed.

This indirect cost policy applies only to project contracts awarded to nonprofit organizations. TMI does not pay indirect costs to individual contractors, private companies, or government agencies.
